

His cultural-anthropological observations of positions in the Western (art) world serve as source material for his sculptures and spatial installations. Kanu's assemblages of various 'found' materials appear aesthetically sophisticated but do not disguise their original use. Formally they reference cultural phenomena typical of the southern states in the US, including the aesthetics of 'slab culture', an offshoot vehicle modification. or the material practice of Black southern artists. Kanu's practice is reminiscent of the way in which materials are assembled in art practices of Western modernity that have drawn on non-Western cultures while ignoring characteristics such as questions of animism or original animations of objects.

The conversation will be in English. Entry is free and limited to the number of seats available. Dozie Kanu (Houston, 1993) lives and works in Santarém and Almada, Portugal.
